Coaches to conduct a walk through before each session and before gymnasts enter the room and any obstructions are cleared. Gymnasts are supervised at all times by coaches within the coaching ratio. All staff to be aware of boisterous behaviour which could lead to injury and intervene when necessary. All gymnasts are to be prevented from practicing gymnastics in any area of the facility other than the gym. All coaches are only to coach within the limits of their own skills qualification. 	L	L	Low
Slips, trips, bumps and grazes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Employees/Staff Young Persons Volunteer Workers Visitors Public 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff should conduct dynamic and regular safety inspections of all equipment for faults or signs of deterioration. All faults to be reported to the Centre Manager or the Head Coach and/or the admin team who will arrange for its immediate repair or removal. Coaches to conduct a walk through before each session and before gymnasts enter the room and any obstructions are cleared. Any spillages are reported to cafe staff and/or admin team and cleaned up, and hazard signage is placed on the floor area near the spillage. All staff to be aware of boisterous behaviour which could lead to injury and intervene when necessary. All staff are adequately trained in the use of equipment used during the session and regular continuation training sessions are attended. 	M	L	Low
